Alzheimer’s Community Care / Council on Aging at the Kane Center	Martin County HUGS – Creating a Dementia-Friendly Community in Martin County - Year 2	Provide second year funding to continue effort to create a dementia-friendly community in Martin County incorporating an all-sector approach to support families coping with Alzheimer’s, including but not limited to educating / training for law enforcement, retail, and government employees.
ARC of Martin County	Renovating a Community Home for Individuals with Special Needs	Provide matching funds to ensure successful completion of ARC group home improving accessibility and improve hurricane migration capacity while reducing energy and water usage.
Boys & Girls Clubs of Martin County	Boys & Girls Clubs K-8 Student Success Project	Improve educational outcomes for youth in grades K-8 through the Club’s AmeriCorps-funded programs.
Helping People Succeed	Language & Literacy Connection - Year 3	Provide funding to assist early language and literacy initiative. Focused on increasing school readiness and increasing proficiency in 3 rd grade reading.
Historical Society of Martin County	Historic Structure Report on the House of Refuge	Provide funding for a Historical Structures Report that will enable the House of Refuge to seek additional support to repair and maintain physical structure.
House of Hope	Produce Packing Center	To build a modular steel building that will provide a clean environment which meets USDA food safety practices for processing harvested food and gleaned produce. The Packing Center will also have the capability to offer community gardening and food demonstrations and workshops.
Ocean Research & Conservation Association	Understanding and communicating the risk of toxin transfer from algae blooms	To gather a comprehensive understanding of the exposure of the Martin County community to the cyanotoxin microcystin with a goal of creating a comprehensive community wide education plan that includes individual goals, education materials and implementation plans to target the general public, subsistence fishing communities, health professionals, local governments and politicians, and other decision makers.
The Arts Council of Martin County	Arts + Technology	To purchase technology to increase engagement and participation by offering both virtual experiences (either produced by others and shown by The Arts Council on site or online) and new programming.
TCFMSL NonProfit Leadership Institute & Training	Support Building the Capacity of Nonprofit Executive Leadership	A program funded by The Community Foundation to provide leadership and management training, education and enrichment for non-profit professionals and board members. Specifically, in 2019-20, ten (10) CEOs will participate in a 12-month program including peer group work as well as monthly executive coaching.
